Term 1 Curriculum

This year we are developing our Curriculum. The curriculum is what we bring to children to help them to learn in ways that are interesting and motivating to them. We also follow a Statutory Framework set by the government for children in the Early Years. The framework sets out what children need to learn, our curriculum will set out how we plan to support them with this learning.

Once we are happy with the Curriculum and how it is developing we will add it to our website for you to see. The Curriculum will be built around 6 key goals that we want children to learn. To achieve each "goal" the children will experience a wide variety of learning, which covers all of the subject areas within the Statutory Framework. These include: Personal, Social and Emotional Development, Physical Development, Communication and Language, Literacy, Maths, Expressive Arts ad Design and Understanding of the World. The first three subjects are known as the Prime Areas and they underpin the whole curriculum.

As we move through the year, we will be encouraging you as Parents/Carers to engage with our curriculum and to support your children's learning at home.

This term, our focus is "Being Happy at Nursery". Staff understand the importance of children feeling happy and secure at Nursery before they can begin to explore and find things out for themselves. We want them to learn the adult's names and those of their friends. We want them to know where to find things in the classroom for themselves and we want them to feel happy and settled.

We will share more information about what the children are learning at the beginning of each term.
