E-Safety

Keeping children safe when using the technology is something that Parents/Carers need to be aware of even when they are very young. Teach your child some simple rules from the time they begin to engage with technology. Use secure and legal sites to download games. Websites such as CBBC have great games for children that you know will be safe and appropriate. Young children become very good at finding what they want top view. It is important as a Parent/Carer that you are aware of what they are accessing. Use Children's You Tube as this a safer forum. Sit with your child whilst they play games etc so that you can be sure they are safe.

Term 4 Curriculum

This term our Curriculum focus is "Play A Game". The children will be learning all the skills needed to play a variety of games, both inside and outside. The children will be exploring all areas of the curriculum through this focus:

Personal, Social and Emotional Development: The children will be supported to become increasingly independent with solving their own conflicts and making independent decisions and choices.

Language Development: Building on the new vocabulary from last term as well as beginning to understand sequencing. They will be encouraged to create their own ideas for stories through "Tales Toolkit".

Physical Development: Building on their use of tools from last term, especially their scissor skills. They will be developing their wrist pivot to make controlled marks with chalk, paint and pens. They will be supported to draw figures that are becoming recognisable.

Maths: Continuing to explore "subitising" skills. They will notice groups up to 5 and link this to "how many" e.g. counting spaces in a board game.

Literacy: Exploring rhyme and rhythm in familiar stories, especially traditional tales. They will explore stories with problems to solve and make suggestions on how to do this.

Expressive Art and Design: Moving to different types of movement and talking about "happy" music "sad" music. They will be using play dough and clay to make different shapes and creations.

Understanding of the World: Explore the impact of different forces e.g. rolling, pressing, squashing and exploring other forces in the environment e.g. magnets, pedals on bikes, using ramps.

On Tuesday 19th and Thursday 21st March we would like to invite parents to join us to play games. The workshops will be just before the time you collect your child at the end of their session at 2.30pm. We are hoping for better weather so we can play playground games as well as familiar board games! These sessions provide a great opportunity for you to learn about what your children have been learning. Hope to see you there!
